READ THIS FIRST! ASSEMBLY TIPS:

- To avoid scratches, build on a carpeted surface or blanket.
- When tightening screws with the Allen key – use the long side first, then tighten with the short side.
- The long side of the Allen key can be used AT AN ANGLE! This makes it easier to screw bolts deeper inside rail.
- Bolts can be attached to the end of the long side of the Allen key. Once they are attached to the end you can guide them to the holes.
- If a step uses a nut: use the wrench to hold the nut in place and the Allen key to tighten the bolt.
- Playmats might be creased from shipping. You can flatten your playmats by:
 1. Placing a towel or thick sheet over the playmat.
 2. Using an iron on medium or low settings to iron out the wrinkles. (Don't iron the playmats directly, use the iron on the sheet or towel.)
 3. Make sure to iron the edges of the playmat as well to flatten them.

SAFETY WARNINGS

- After assembly, tighten all screws and bolts every 4-6 months.
- This table contains SMALL PARTS – Keep children under 3 AWAY from the table at all times!
- Maximum table load is 40kg (88lbs).
- Maximum table load of table with Bar Height Extenders is 30kg (66lbs).
- For best care, keep Project Ironside out of direct sunlight and in an environment 19 - 29°C (66 - 84°F).
- To clean wood, use a slightly damp cloth.
- Do not use Project Ironside if the environmental temperature is under 5°C (41°F) or over 35°C (95°F)
- Parts of Project Ironside have been treated, coated and/or polished, but do not use Project Ironside if any parts contain rust or jagged edges.
- Keep metal surfaces dry, and dry immediately if wet.

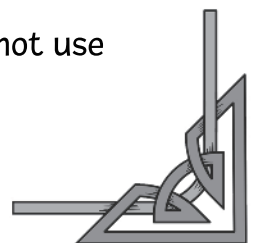
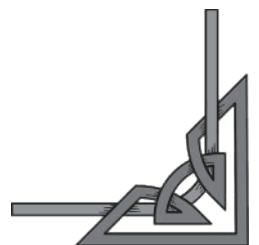
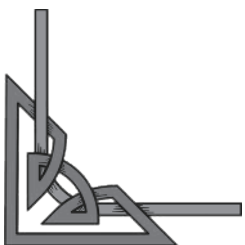


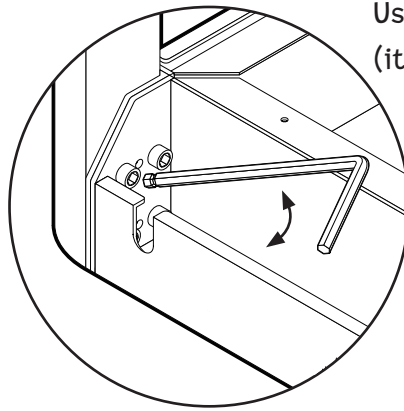
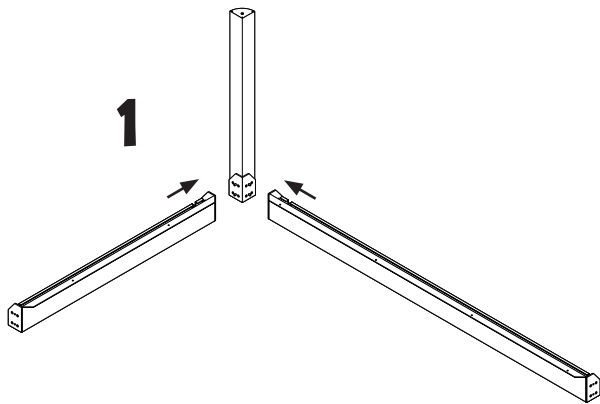

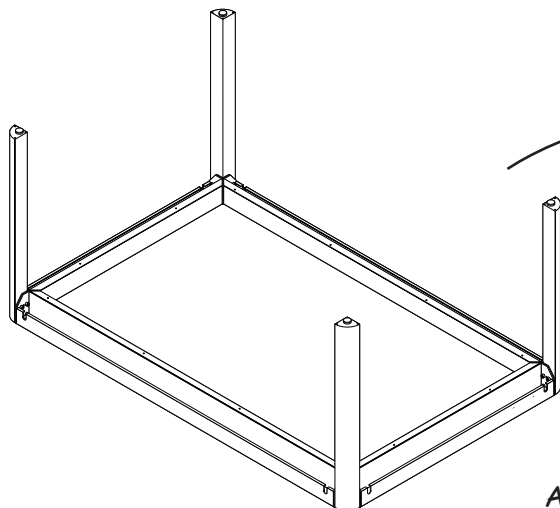
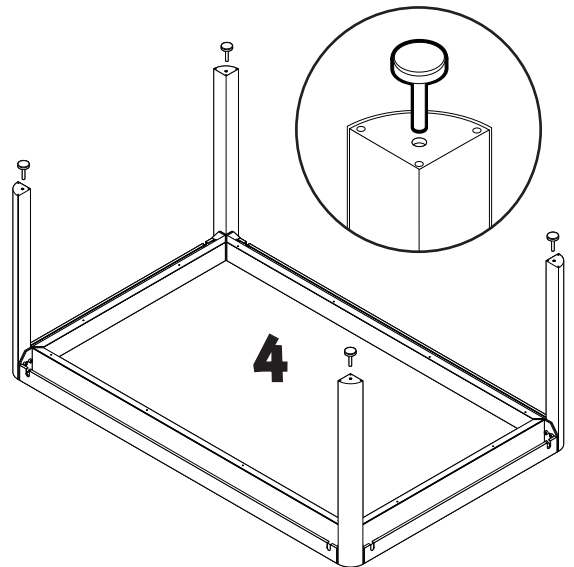
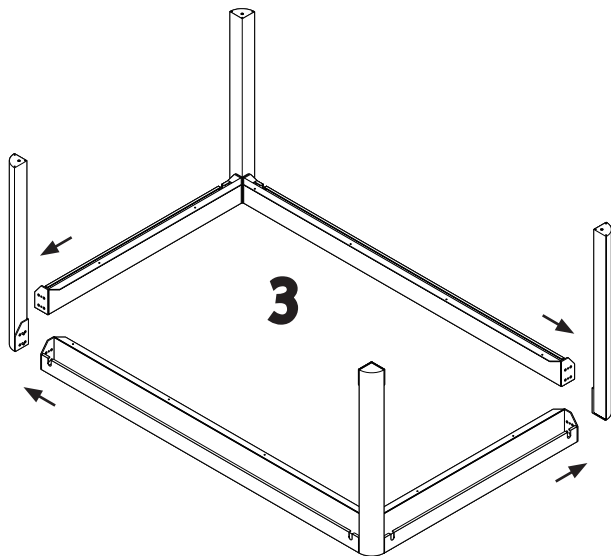
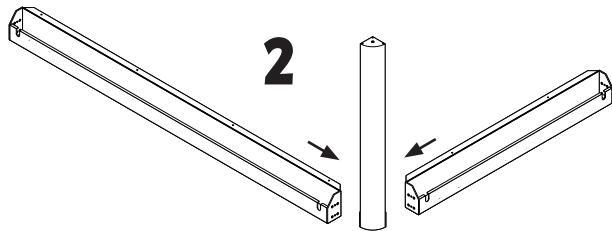
CHAPTER 1: ASSEMBLING THE BASE TABLE



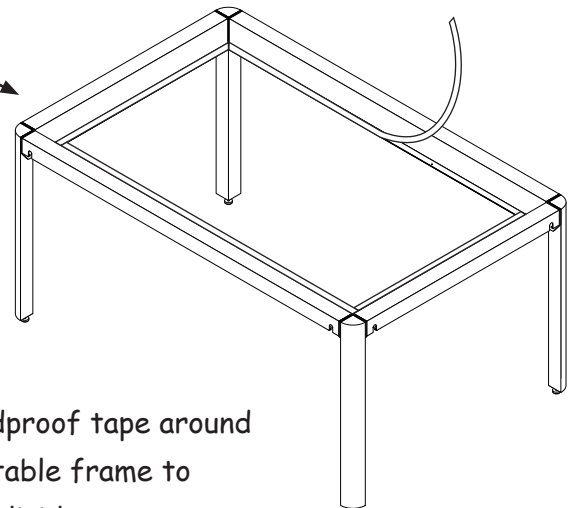
Use the long end of the Allen wrench
(it can be angled)...



...then use the short end to tighten



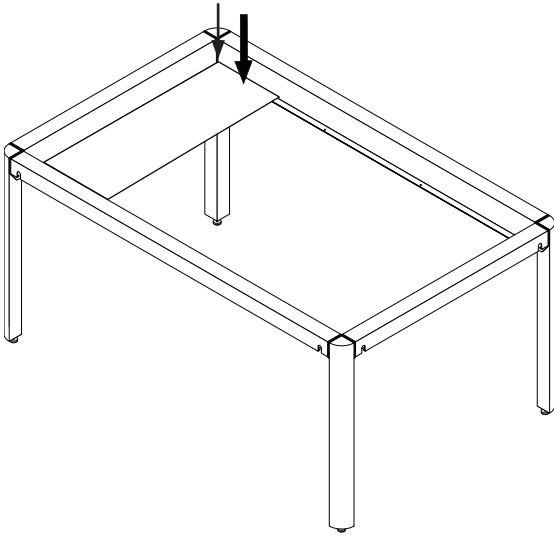
Flip with two people



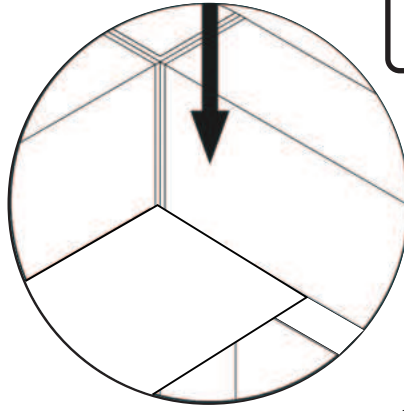

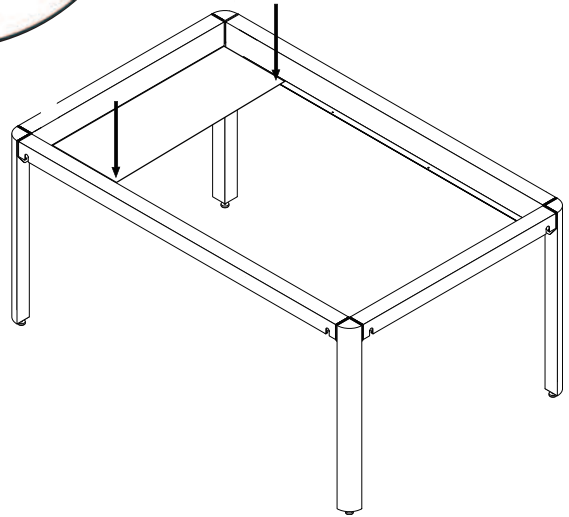
- 6** Place the first board along the inner edge of the table.



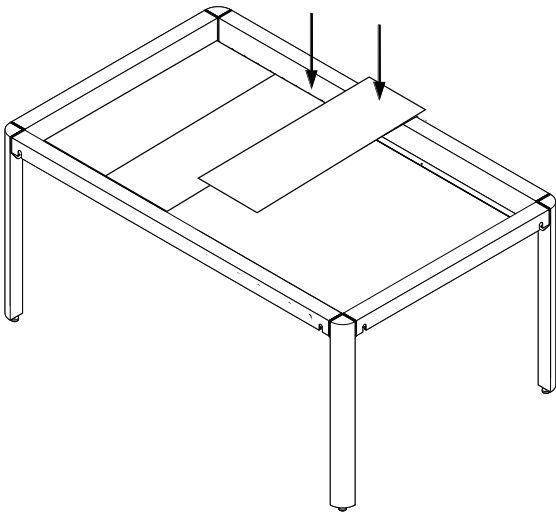
* Tip: Check for gaps and make sure it fits tightly.



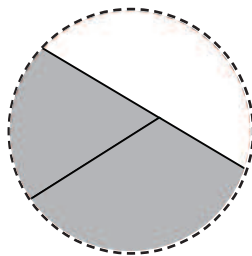
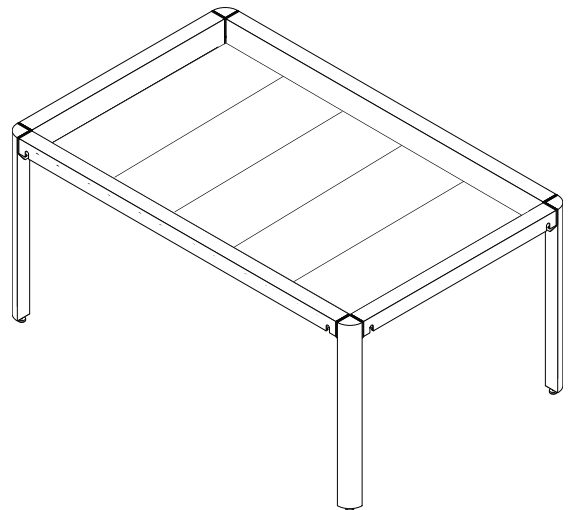
- 7** Align both sides of the board.



- 8** Add the remaining boards, making sure they fit closely together.

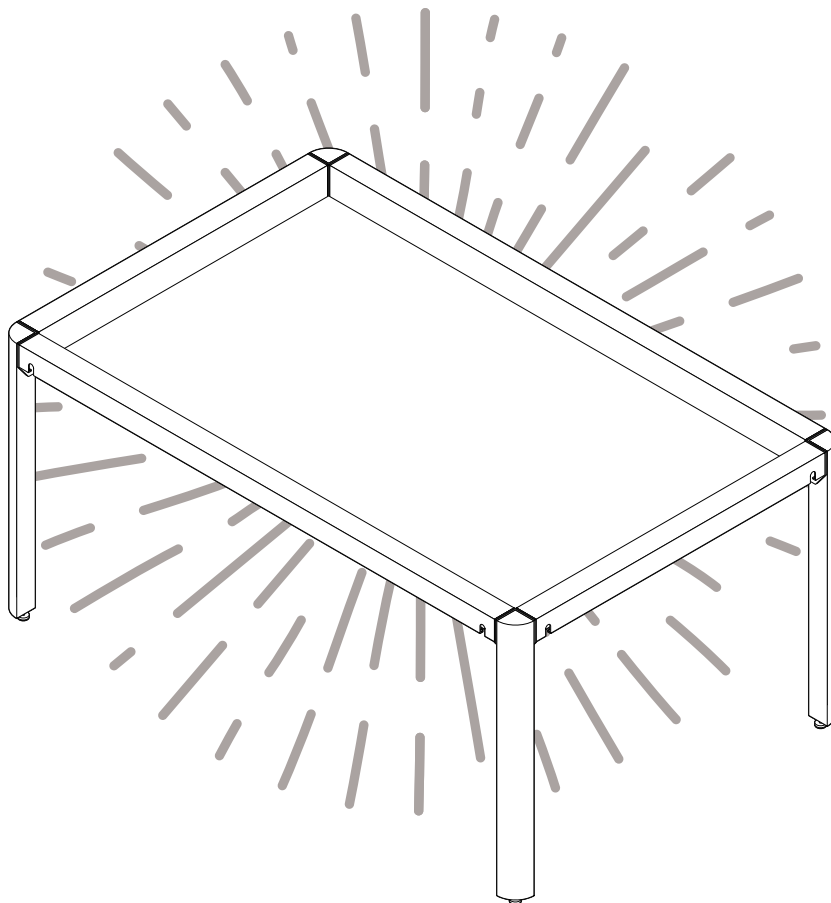
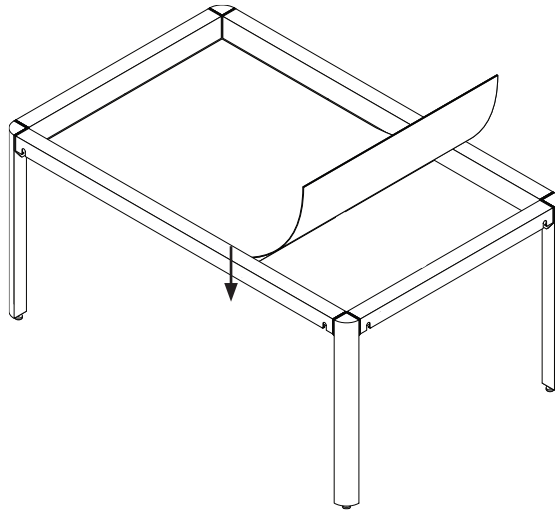


- 9** Make sure all 5 boards are in place and cover the bottom completely.

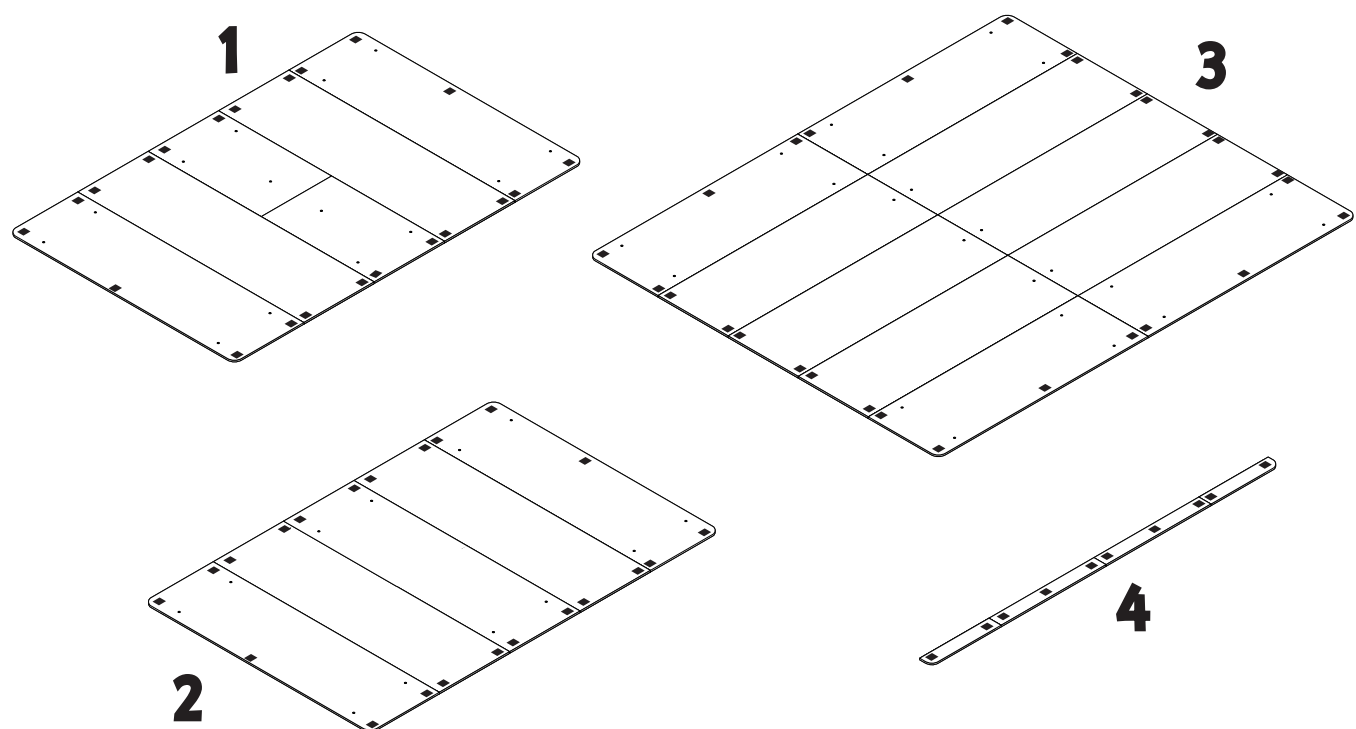


All 48 foam blocks may not fit (they are difficult to place perfectly!)
If the final blocks do not fit – cut them down to size.

10 Unroll and place the playmat on top.



CHAPTER 2: ADDING RUBBER PATCHES TO WOOD TOPPERS



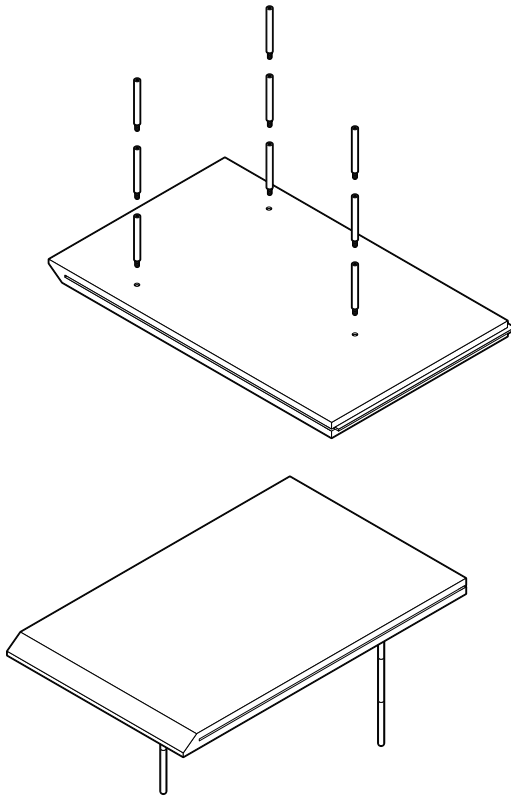
* Rubber patches stop the wood from sliding around – make sure they make full contact with the table frame when the wood toppers are placed!

WOOD TOPPER TYPE	WHERE TO STICK
1 - Regular Topper with Split Middle Panel	4 per Long Panel 5 on End Panels 2 per Split Panel, in the Outer Corners
2 - Regular Topper with Full Middle Panel	4 per Middle Panel 5 on End Panels
3 - 6x5' Huge Wood Topper	2 per Middle Panel 4 on Corner Panels
4 - Edge Caps	2 per Short Piece 3 per Long Piece

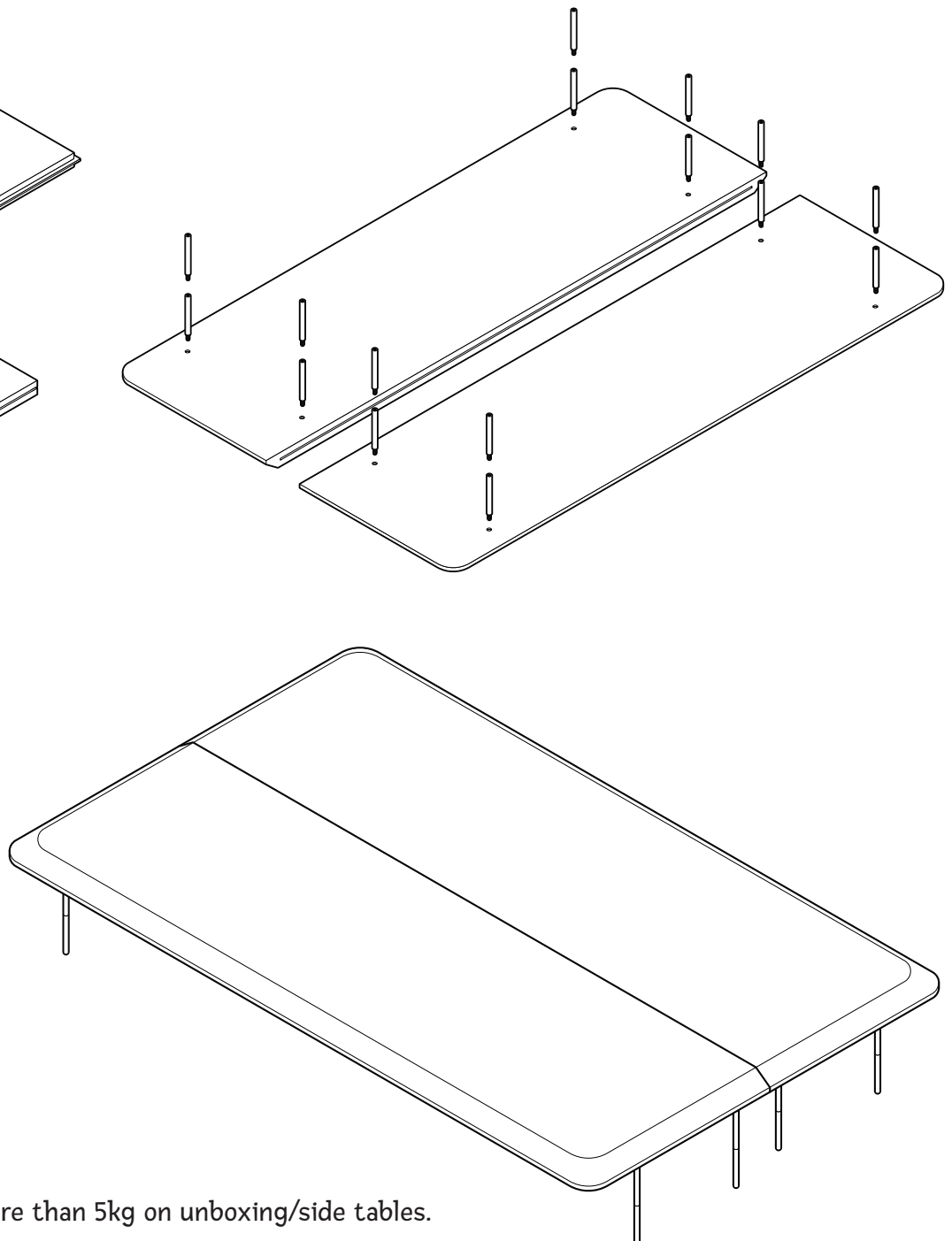
CHAPTER 3: CONVERTING TOPPERS

You can screw the 10cm metal legs into the screw holes located on the underside of wooden panels to create side tables or elevated playing areas. Use the included 4 black coasters under steel legs to protect playmats. If using an 8-leg setup for your Elevated Playing Surface (shown below), cut coasters in half.

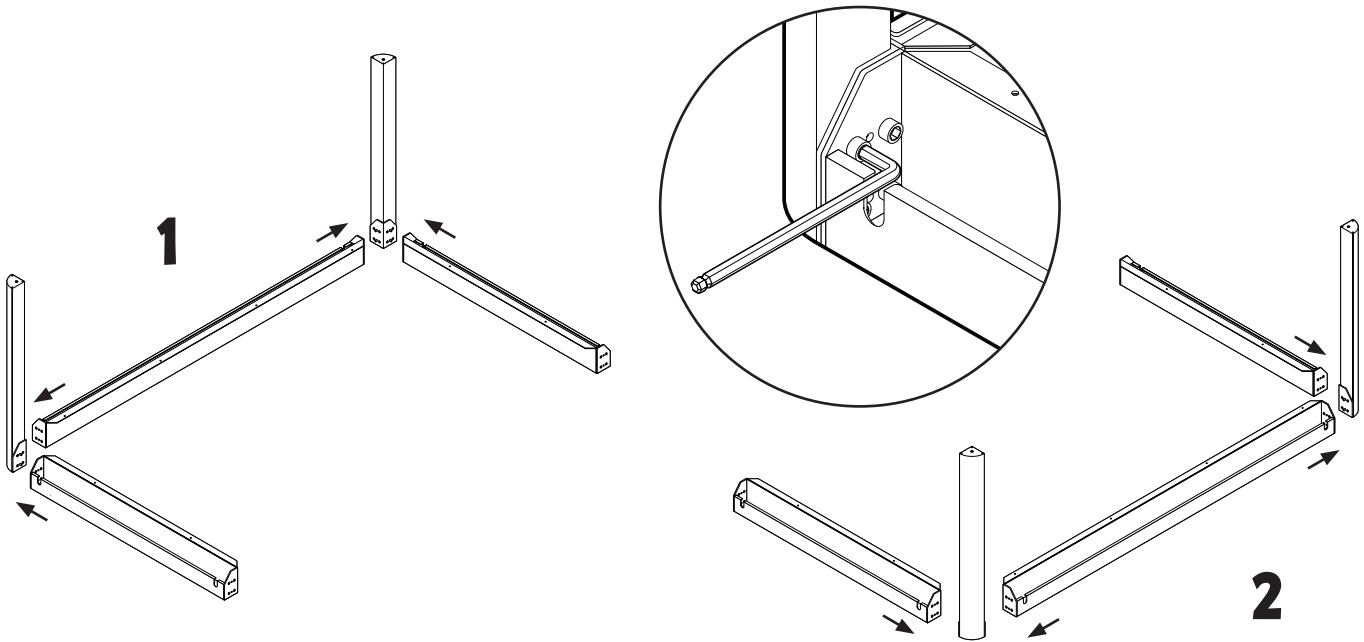

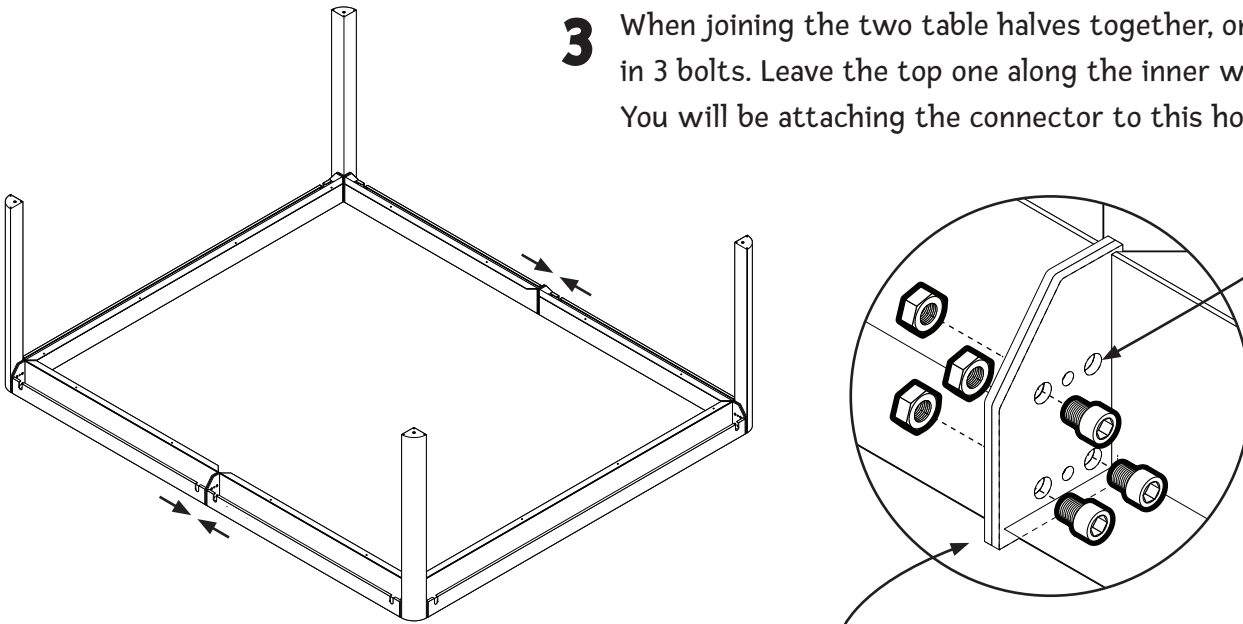
* DO NOT sit or put more than 5kg on unboxing/side tables.

* First use the long side of the Allen key (can be angled), then use the short side to tighten.

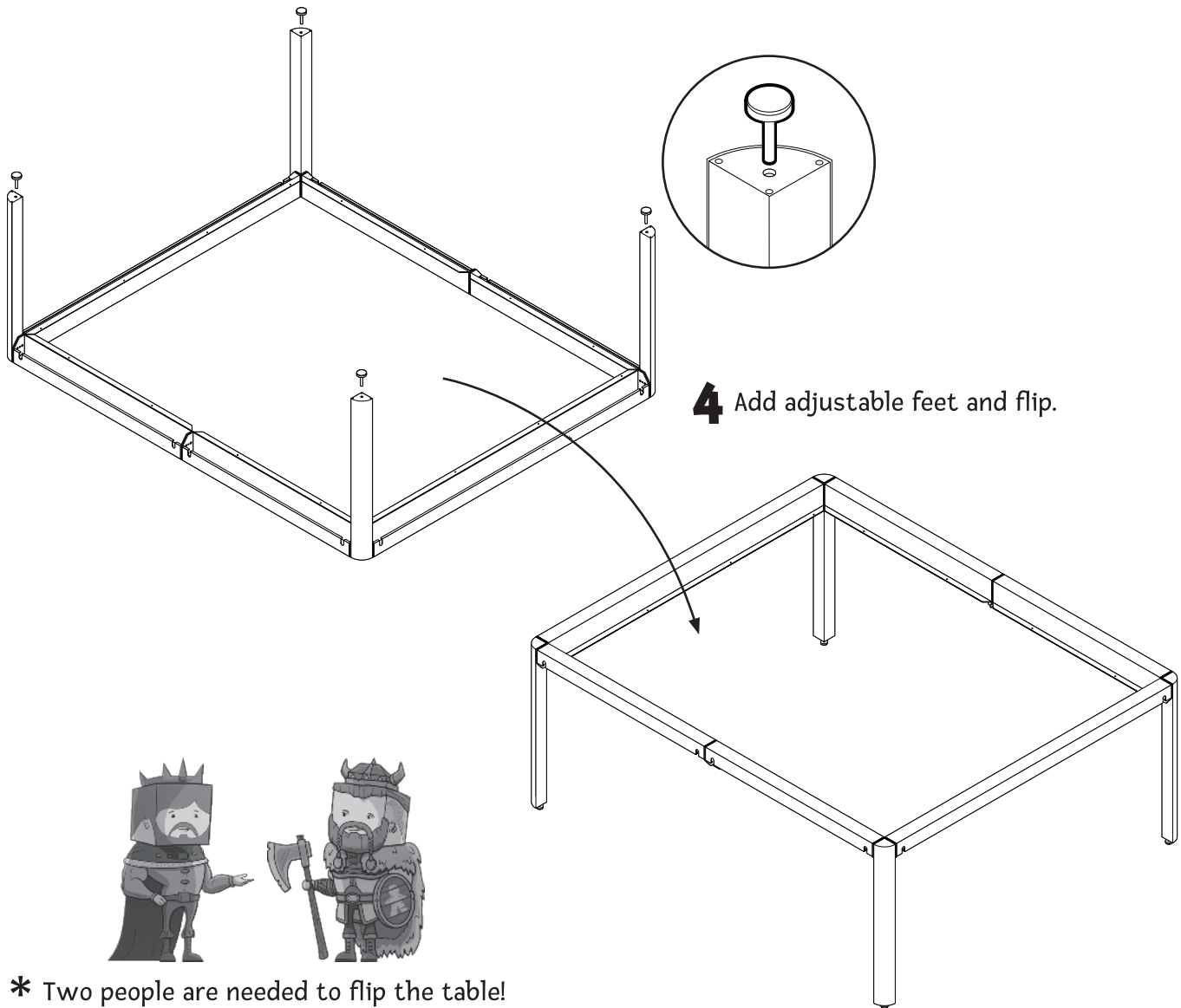


3 When joining the two table halves together, only screw in 3 bolts. Leave the top one along the inner wall empty. You will be attaching the connector to this hole later.

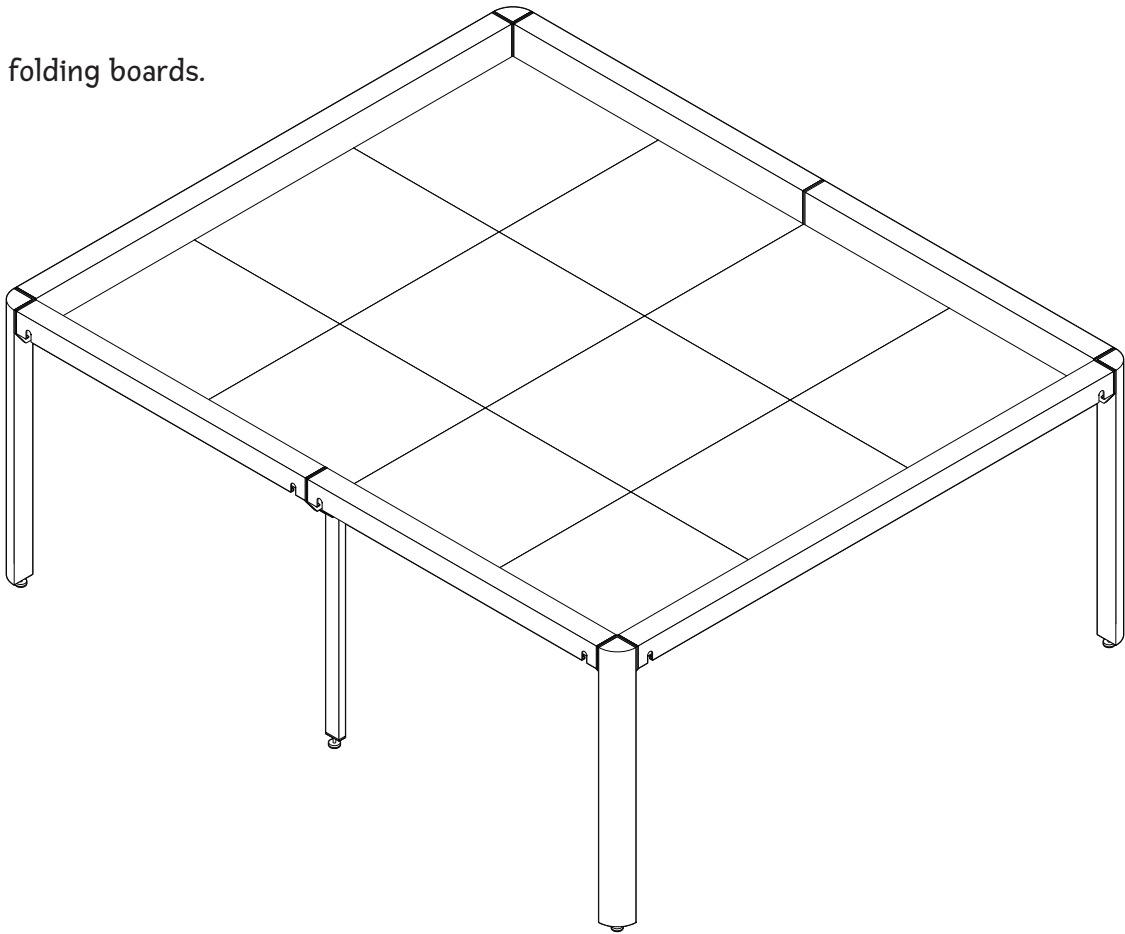


14 Confirm all 10 boards are in place, covering the entire bottom.

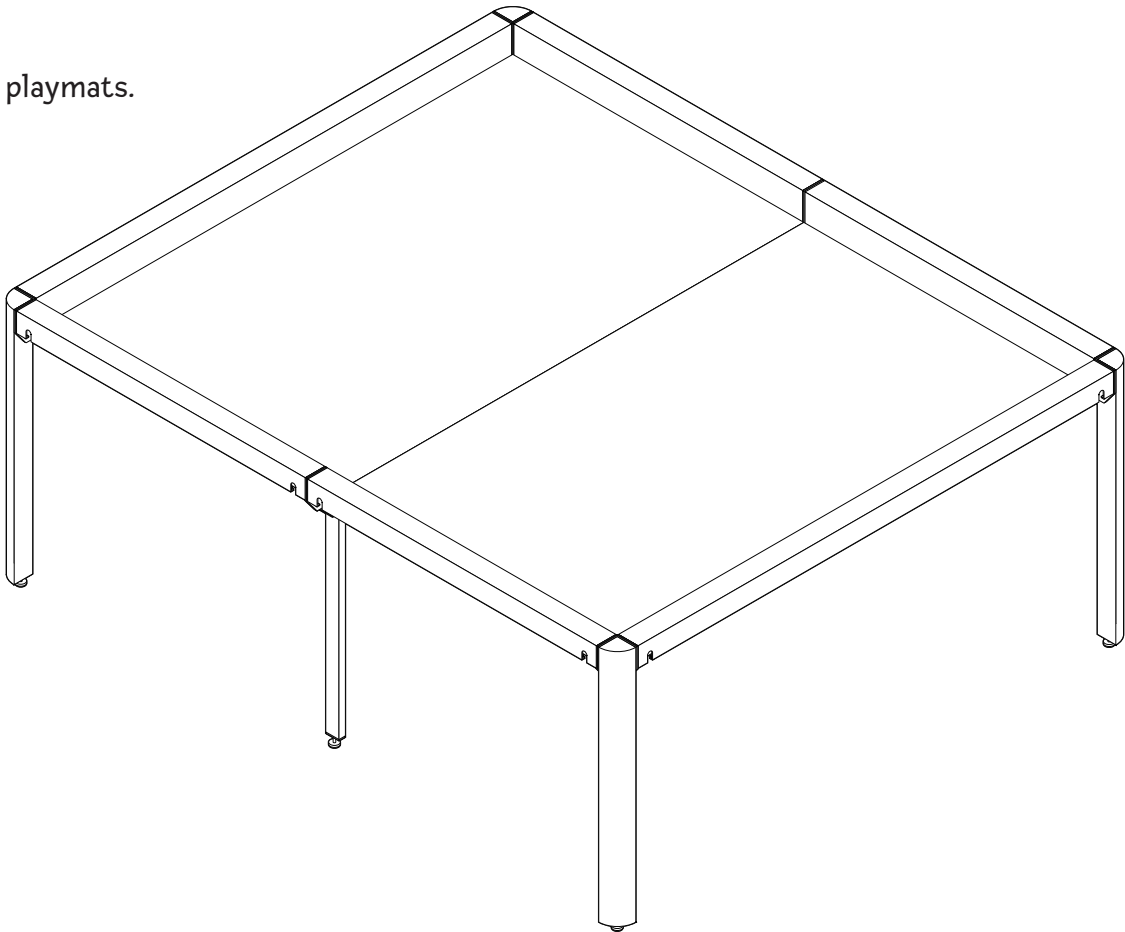

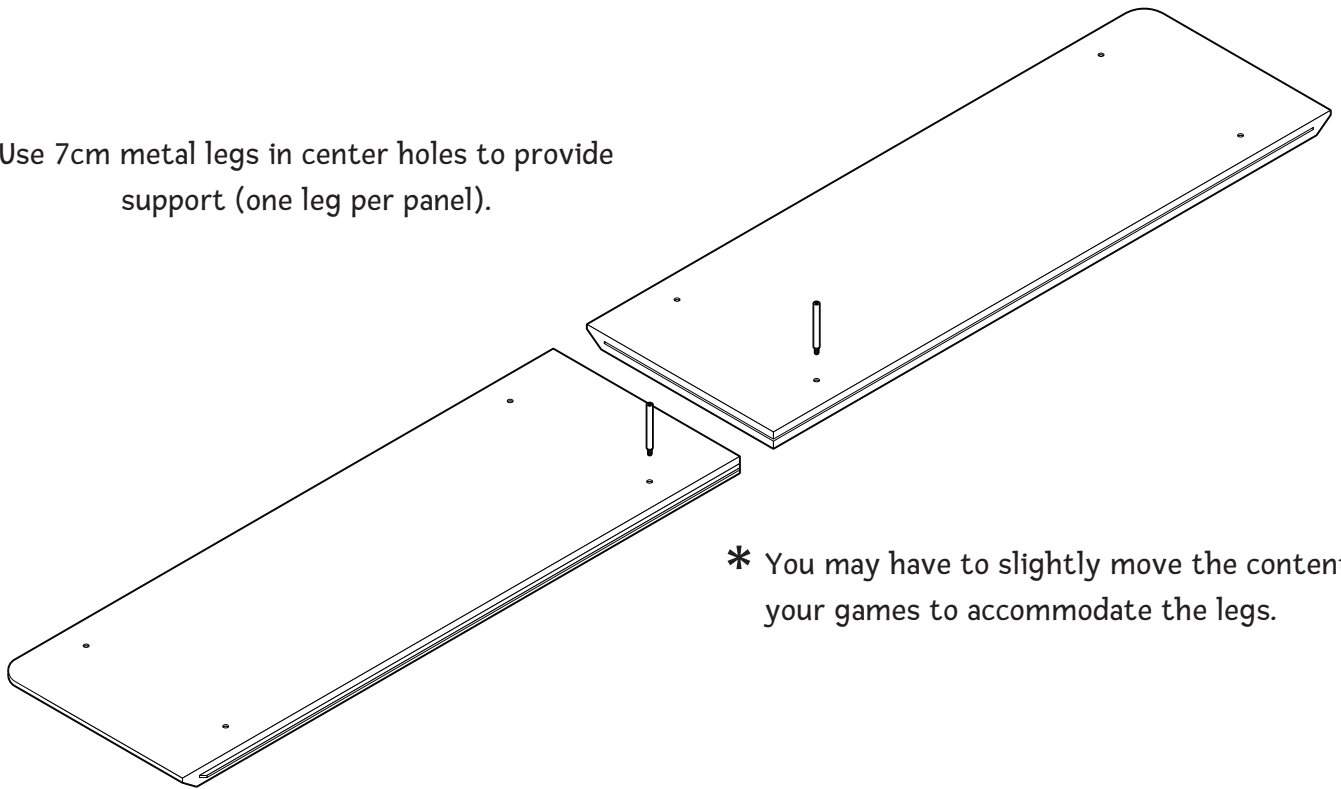

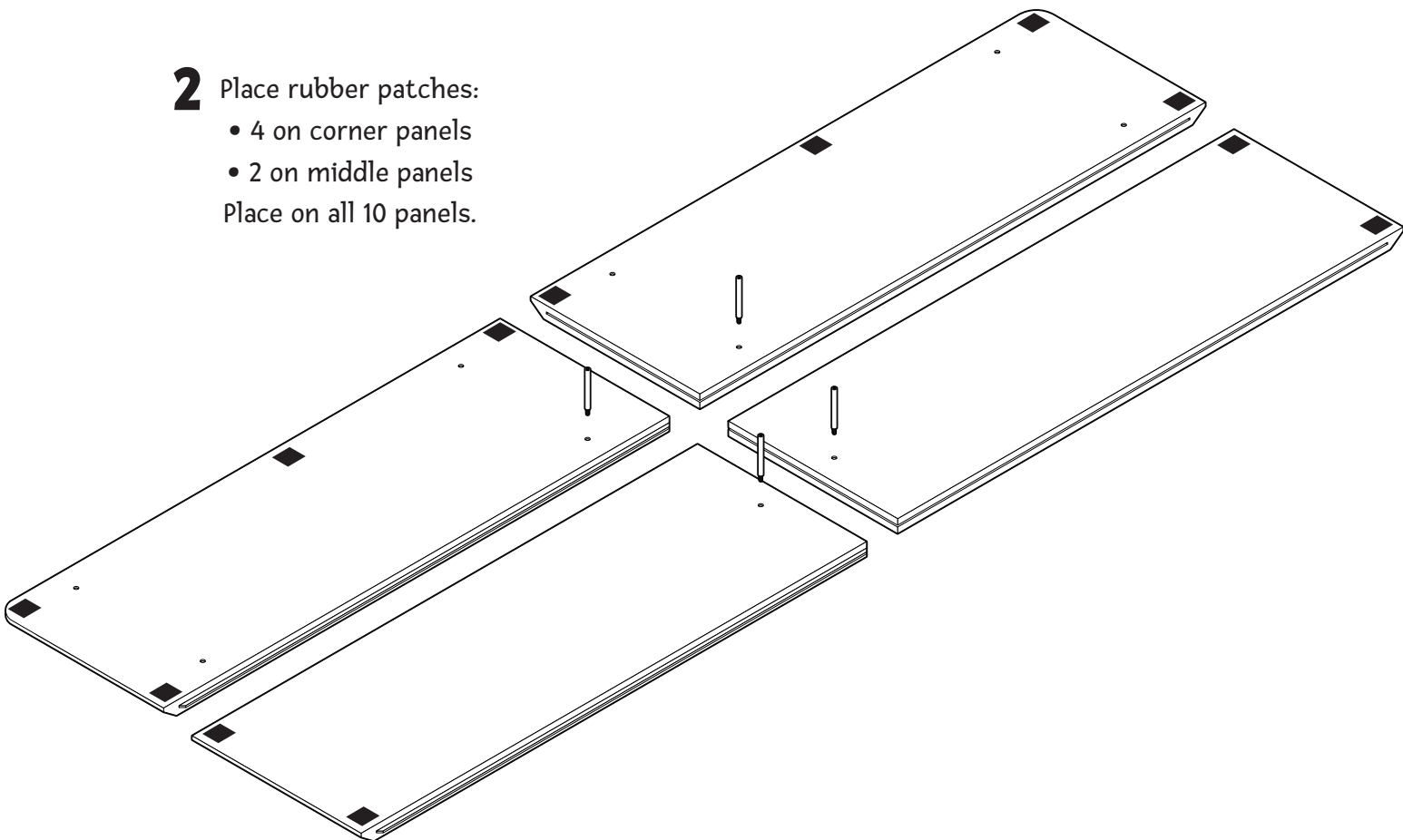
CHAPTER 5: PLACING THE 6'X5' HUGE WOOD TOPPER

- 1** Use 7cm metal legs in center holes to provide support (one leg per panel).

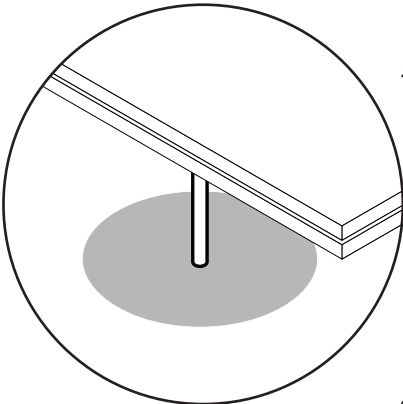


* You may have to slightly move the contents of your games to accommodate the legs.

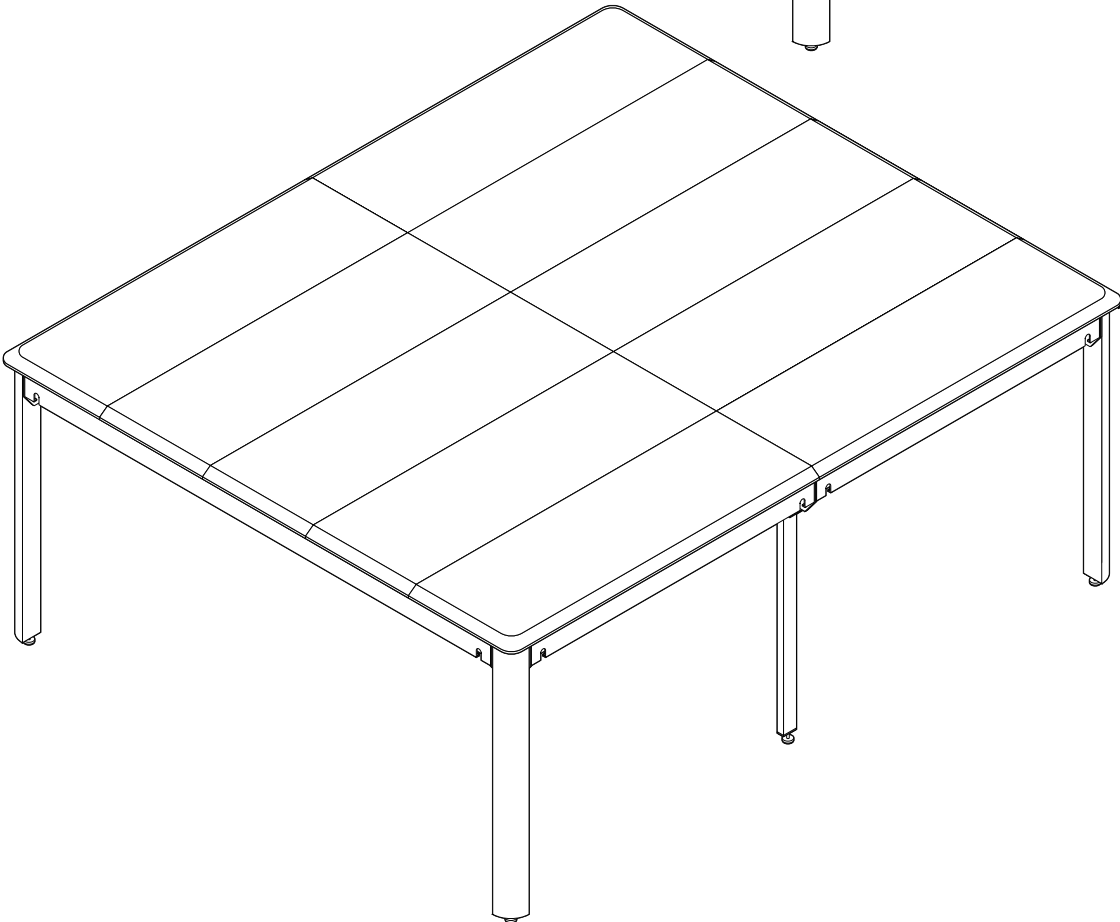
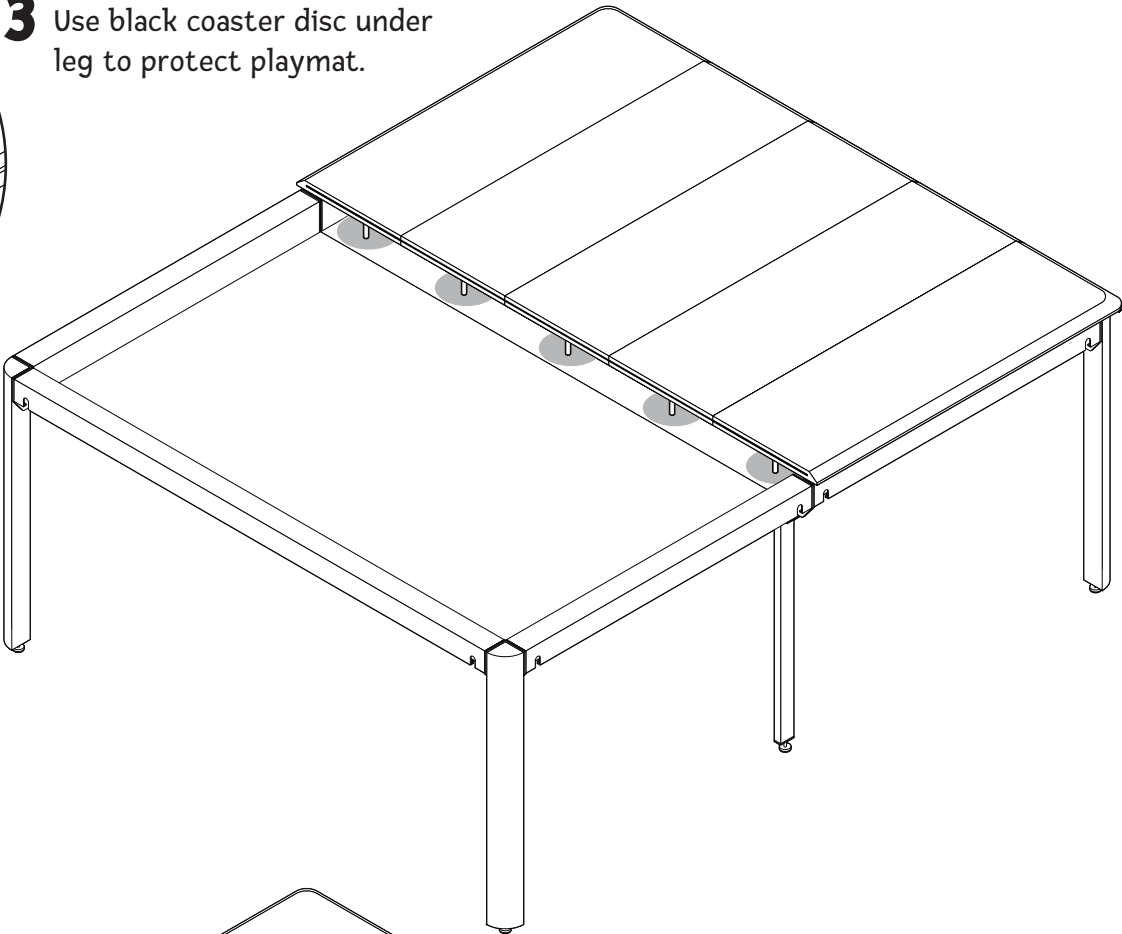
- 2** Place rubber patches:
- 4 on corner panels
 - 2 on middle panels
- Place on all 10 panels.



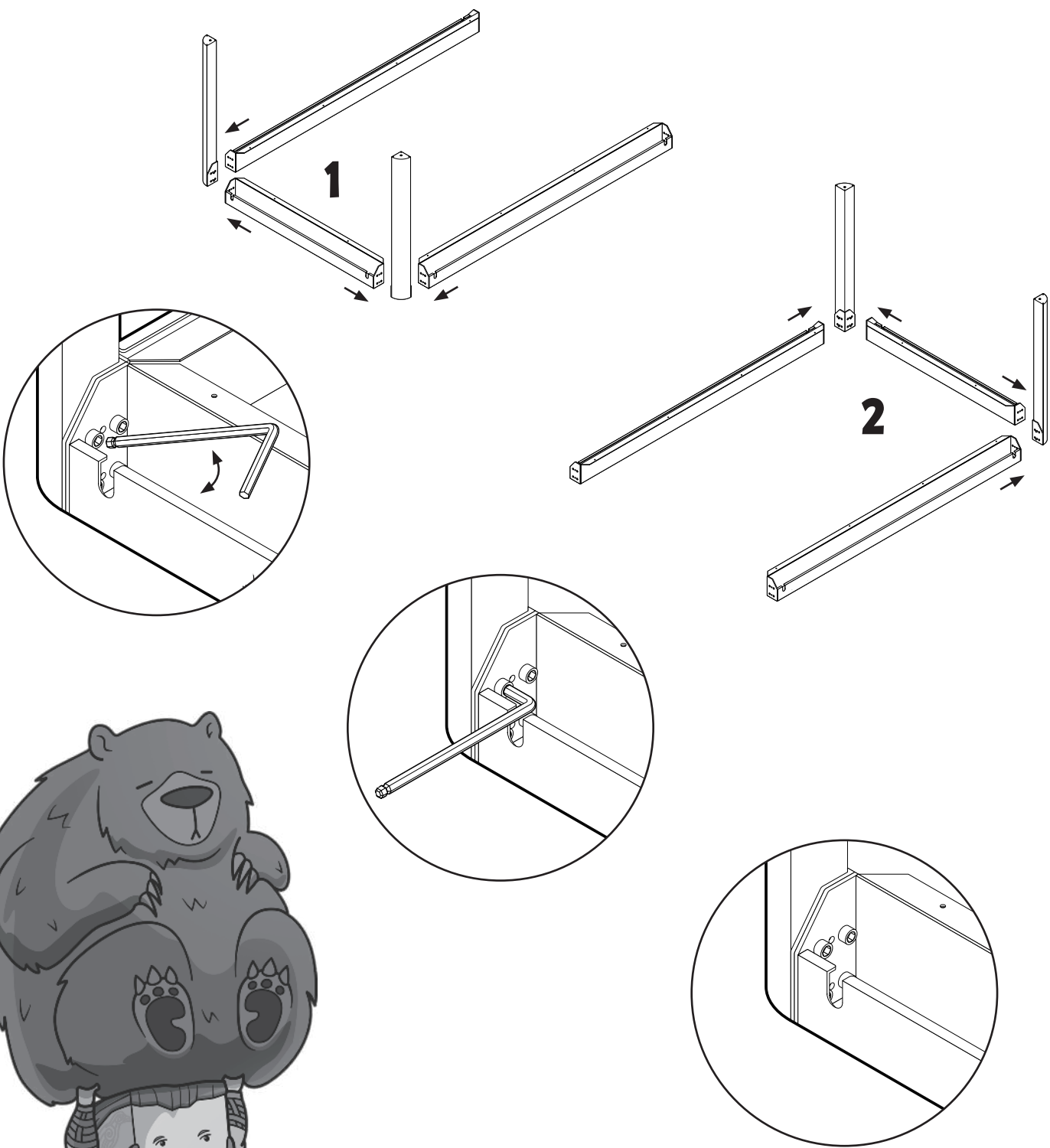

3 Use black coaster disc under leg to protect playmat.

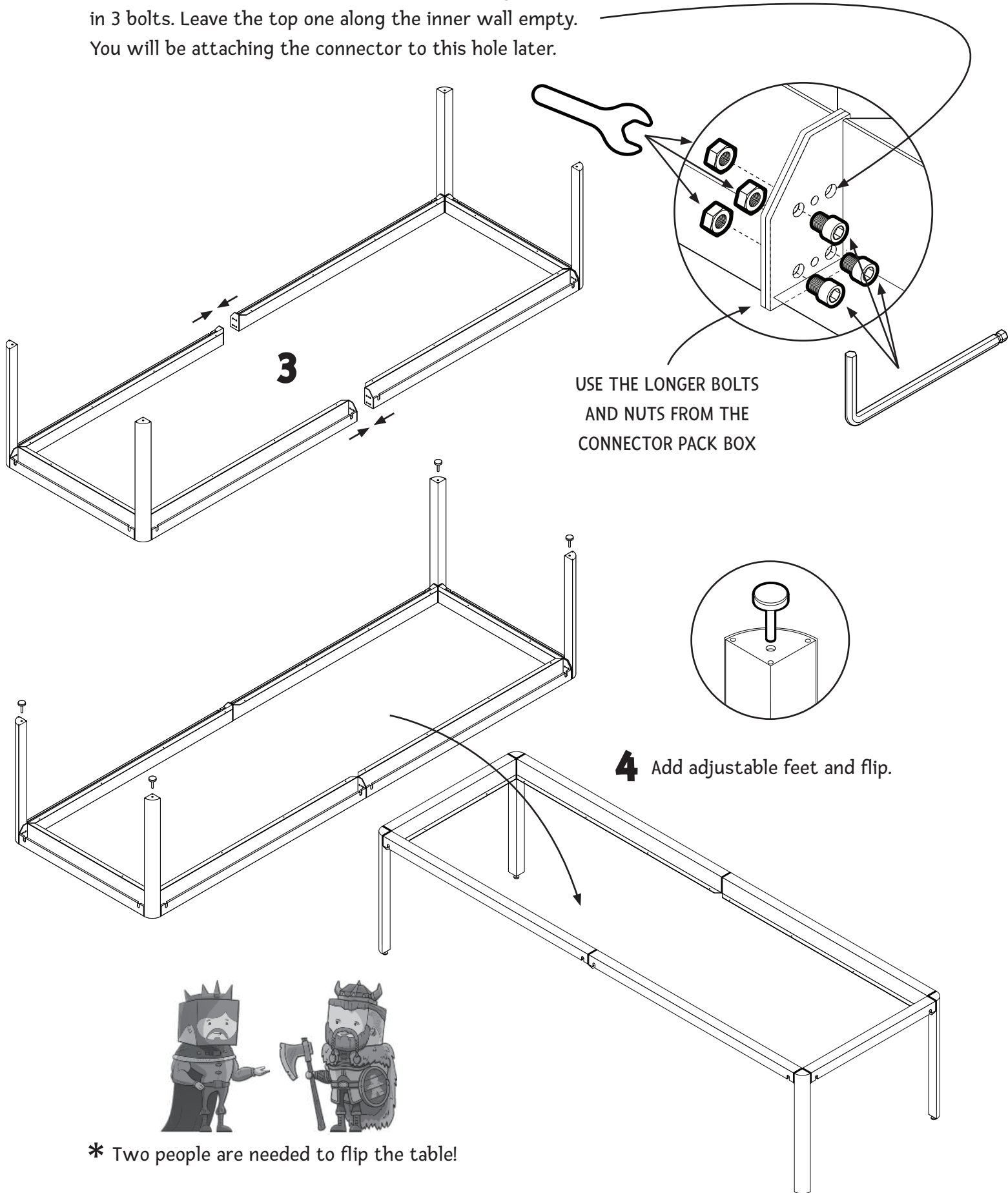

16 Place 2 playmats.



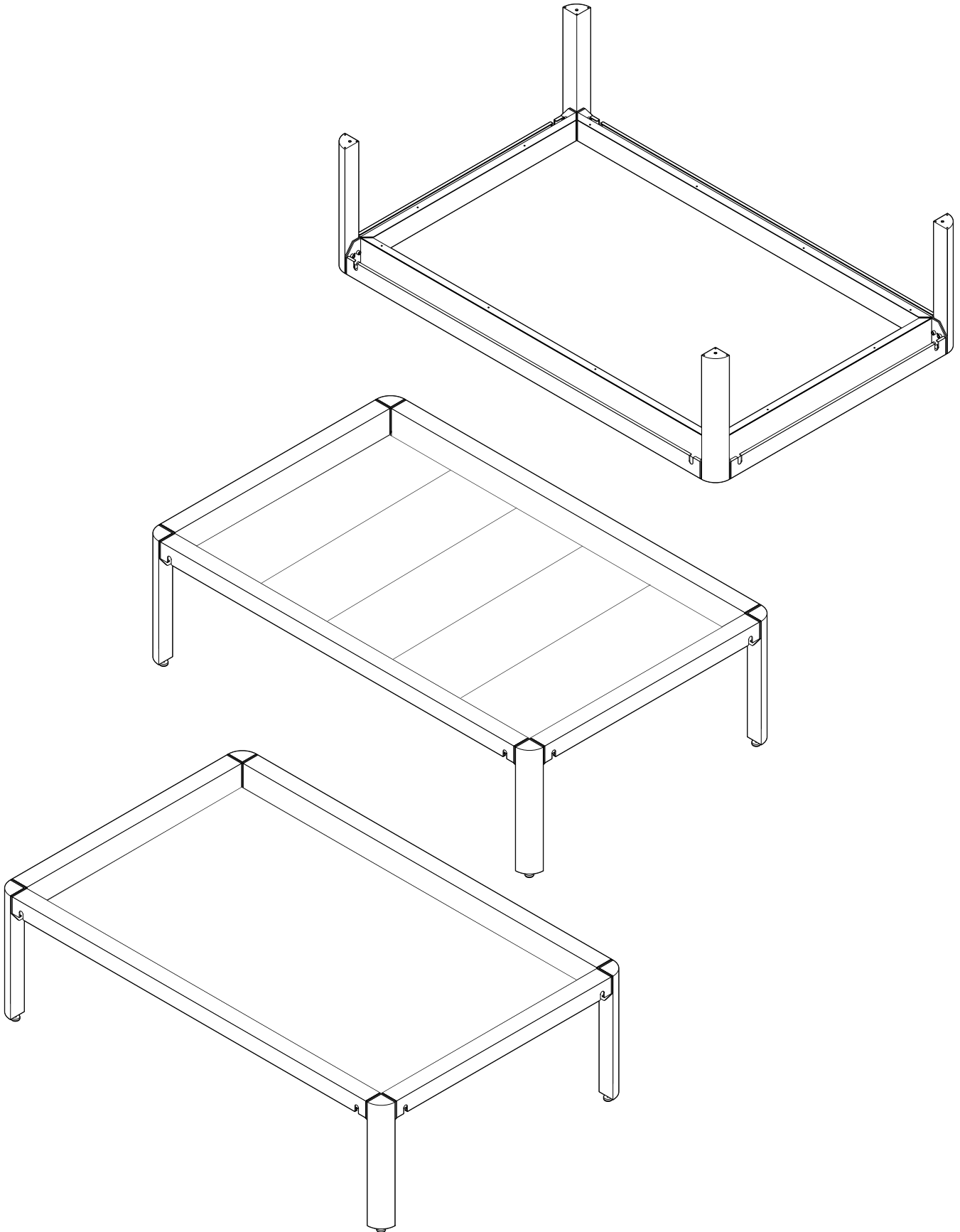
CHAPTER 7: USING THE EXTENSION PACK

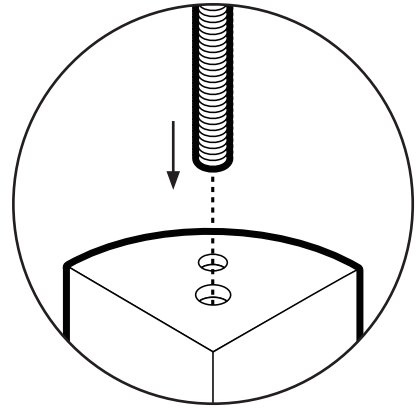
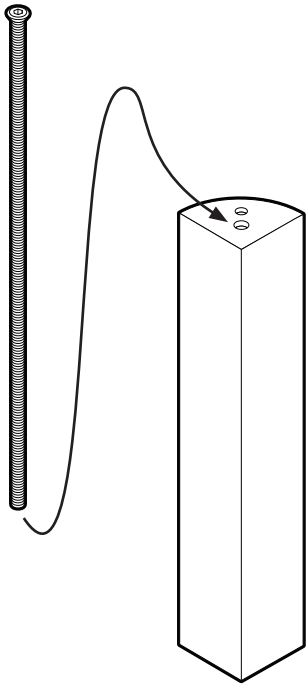

except in Steps 1 and 2, use Coffee Table Legs instead of regular legs.



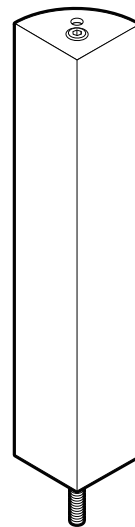
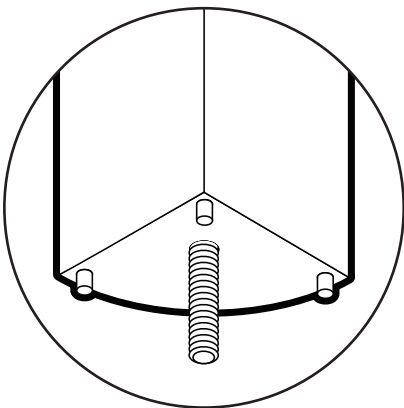
CHAPTER 9: USING THE BAR HEIGHT LEG EXTENDERS

* If you are using Bar Height Extenders on the 6x5' table – follow these same steps for inserting the 3 rectangular Bar Height Extenders into the table connector.

1 Insert leg bolt into hole in extender leg.

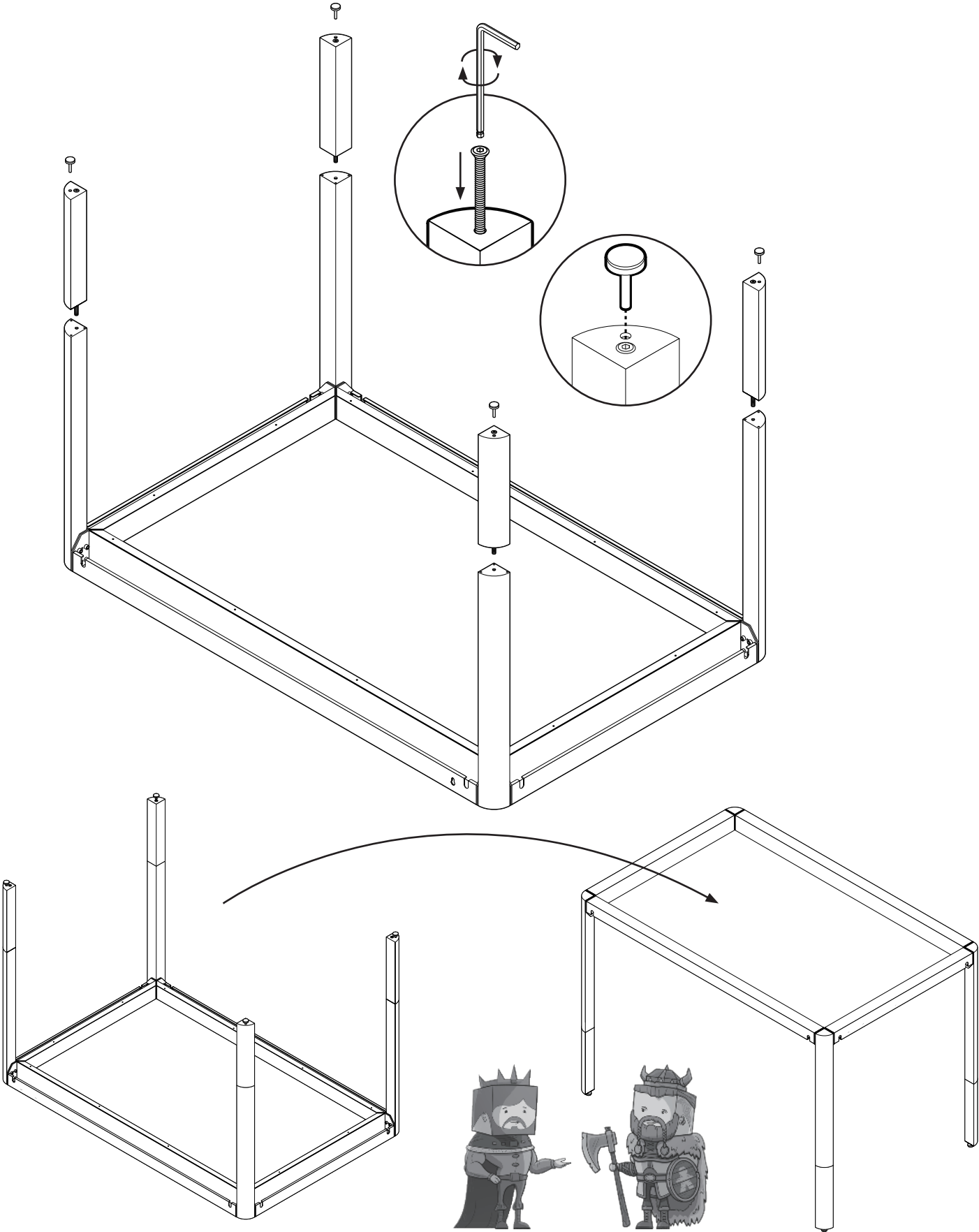


2 Push bolt out the other side.

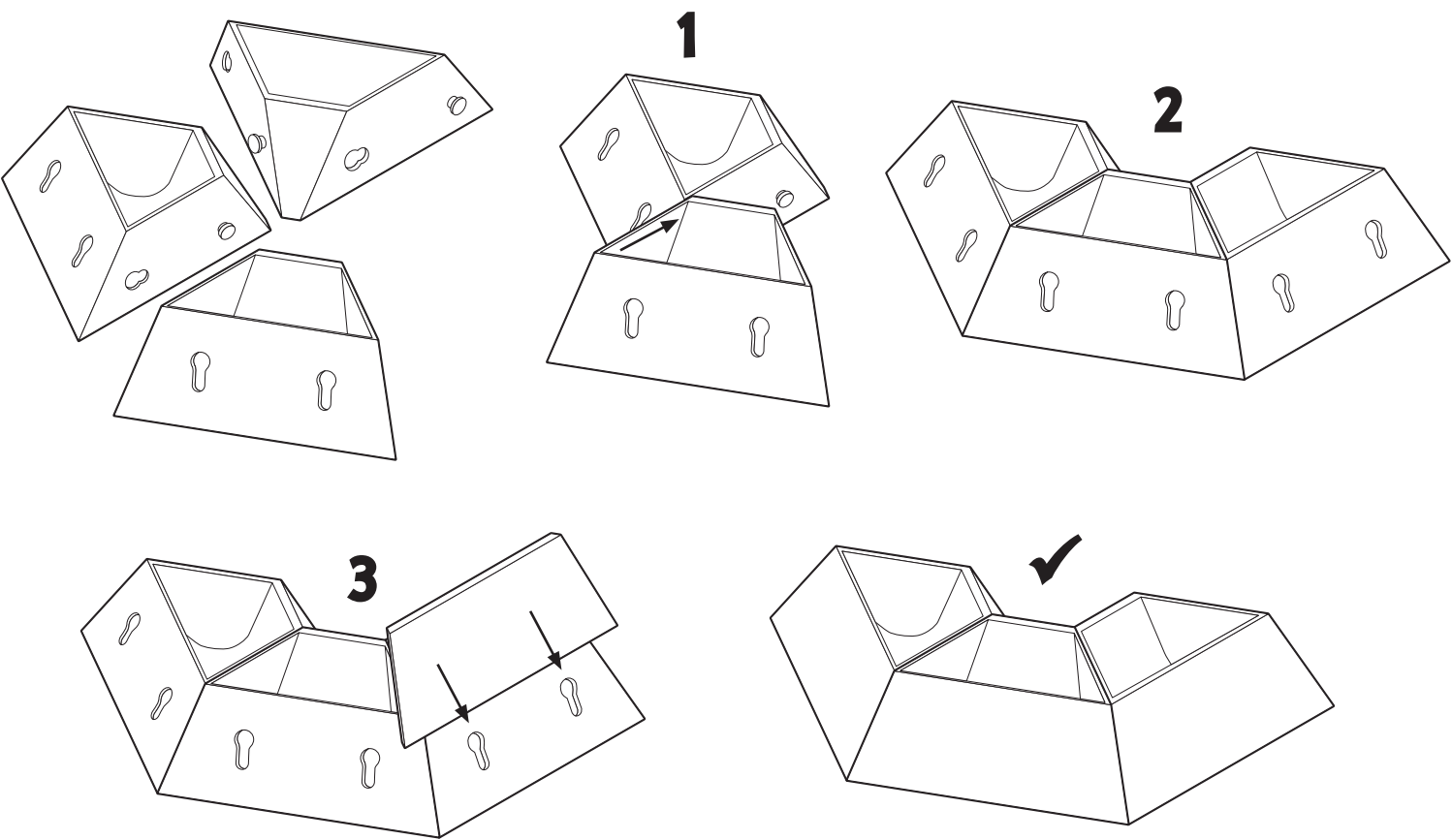
3 Screw bolts into the regular table legs and add adjustable feet to extensions.



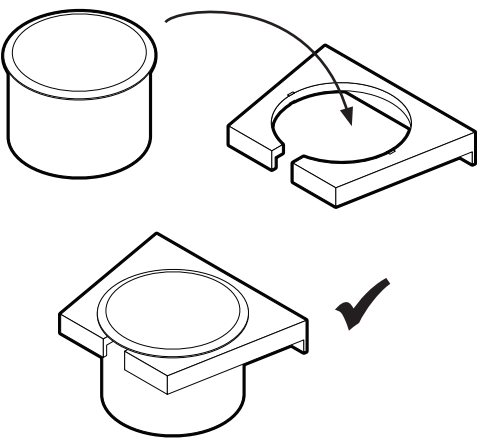
